Peace Country residents pride themselves on being self-reliant and hardy folk. They also have a strong sense of community spirit and will go out of their way to help a neighbor out.

Residents love outdoor activities. From sports to swimming, kayaking, canoeing, horseback riding, boating, biking, skiing, running, walking, golfing, camping, quadding, skidooing, hunting, fishing, gardening, barbecuing or just sitting around a campfire with good friends and family.

The Peace Country produces canola, oats, peas, barley, hay, flaxseed, rye as well as world class honey.

The Peace also boasts many livestock ranches, including beef cattle, dairy cattle, pigs, sheep, lambs and horses. It also accounts for 14% of Canada's bison herd. Other industries include oil & gas and forestry.

Fairview & area residents love music and boast numerous music festivals each year. The most popular music is Folk, Country, Celtic, Bluegrass and Gospel.

Fairview & Area has a vibrant arts community – the Fairview Fine Arts Centre, as well as homemade crafts and natural products, which are featured with homegrown local food and goodies at the Fairview Farmers' Market, held at the Fairview Legion most Wednesdays.

Fairview & Area residents love their local hockey team, The Fairview Flyers. Come out for a game at the Fairplex Arena and cheer them on.





- That FCSS is an innovative, made in Alberta approach to delivering preventive social programs
- Even though it has been around for more than 50 years, you may not have heard much about FCSS. We don't hear about preventing drug and alcohol abuse, preventing crime, preventing isolation, because when prevention works it's not widely broadcast. Avoiding a crisis isn't news
- FCSS strategically invests in programming that helps to reduce crime, reduce health care dependency, reduce employment barriers for vulnerable Albertans and enhance our economy
- Research has shown that for every \$1 invested in preventive services, \$7 - \$12 dollars in future spending is saved. Longterm spending is reduced for justice, health care, and addiction treatment (Heckman, Moon, Pinto, Savelyev & Yavitz, 2010)

## To qualify for support, the proposed project shall:

 Enhance the social well-being of individuals, families and community through prevention

## Do one or more of the following:

- Help people to develop independence, strengthen coping skills and become more resistant to crisis
- Help people to develop an awareness of social needs
- Help people to develop interpersonal and group skills
- Help people and communities to assume responsibility for decisions and actions which affect them
- Provide supports that help sustain people as active participants in the community

## Programs and Services NOT ELIGIBLE under the program include those that:

- Provide primarily for the recreational needs or leisure time pursuits of individuals
- Are intended to sustain an individual or family, i.e., providing food, clothing or shelter
- Are primarily rehabilitative in nature; or duplicate services that are ordinarily provided by a government or government agency

# Deadline for 2026 applications is October 31, 2025 LATE APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED

Successful applicants will have funds released approximately August 2026. Applicants will be required to complete bi-annual reports based on outcome measures while recognizing FCSS in promotions and marketing of the program.
